



**Purpose:**

The Police activity accounts for the operations of the Red Wing Police Department, including the Community Service Officers. The Police Department provides public safety within our community through an easily recognizable presence and valued partnerships with our citizens. The Police Department enforces federal, state and local laws fairly and prudently.

The Police Department also provides educational, neighborhood and crime prevention programs and other Community Service activities. Patrol and Investigative services provide 24-hour-a-day service to the community by responding to crimes, traffic accidents, medical emergencies, fires, public safety hazards, domestic disputes and other law enforcement needs. Over 15,000 emergency and non-emergency calls are responded to per year.

**Scope of Services:**

- Maintain mobile capacity to prevent, suppress and investigate criminal activities.


- Address community and neighborhood problems by actively working directly with businesses, citizens and community groups.

**Purpose:**

The Civil Defense activity accounts for the coordination of all civil defense and emergency management services for the city. Emergency management activities and planning are a requirement of the Federal and State Government.

The city's Emergency Management staff works closely with Goodhue County Office of Emergency Management.

**Scope of Services:**

- Provide validated material and information for the revisions to the County's Emergency Response Policy and Procedures.
- Train city staff in emergency management procedures.
- Provide information to city residents.

- Successfully demonstrate reasonable assurance for response to Prairie Island Nuclear Generating Plant during the FEMA/NRC biennial exercises.
