**What Happened?
Five Forces Colliding**

- Lived through the broadest and deepest economic recession in our lifetime. Nobody knows what the *new normal* is yet.
- Downward pressure from a continuing recession-prone state budget and an uncertain long term local – state future.
- Movement to redesign, reconfigure and re-examine how we provide traditional services.
- Citizen expectations are changing and evolving, finding new revenues and raising additional property taxes is a challenge.
- Our own expectations; our ability to deliver is faced with unprecedented challenges.

The New Normal Means

- Slower economic growth – about 60% as fast
- Slower growth of investments, incomes, profits, wages, etc.
- Less consumption, more saving
- Chronic government deficits and cuts in service
- Worries about how to pay for past promises
- More uncertainty in our personal and national futures
- A whole new way of looking at opportunities
