



dollars are going.*


For instance, for every tax

Proposed 2021 General Fund Budget


*This chart shows





Resistance-Response Reports

- 2019 Resistance-Response:
 - 79 incidents, 87 subjects were involved.
 - Within the 79 ICR's created, 133 Resistance Response Reports were completed by Officers.
 - No Reports included the discharge of a firearm.
 - No K9 apprehensions
 - No reports of excessive force being used by officers or by supervisors.
- Of the 79 Incidents of Resistance-Response:
 - White – 57 (65%)
 - Black – 24 (27%)
 - Native American – 5 (6%)
 - Unknown – 2 (2%)
- Employee Injuries:
 - 10 Officers reported injuries.
 - 3 of the 10 required ER visit
